

Argyle

Finished Size: 63" x 77"

Finished Block Size: 6 3/4" x 9"

Description: This quilt is a lot of fun to make and can be pulled together easily from a mix of dark, medium and light fabrics. I used all batiks, however you can choose your favorite fabric style so long as you work with a variety of dark and medium prints. Many of my quilts contain more fabrics than the requirements call for – I enjoy throwing in an extra print or two from my stash just to spice things up. The requirements below list the necessary yardage as well as the total number of rectangles needed if you choose to work from your stash. Enjoy!

SUPPLIES:

Suggested Pattern: Argyle

Sewing machine in good working order
Basic rotary cutting and sewing supplies
9 1/2" x 9 1/2" square ruler – or larger
OPTIONAL: 2 yds white flannel for design wall

Materials

1/4 yard **each of 4 different** dark fabrics for blocks,
OR a variety of 14 different rectangles, 7 3/4" x 10"
Choose a mix of dark browns, purples and blue fabrics.

1/4 yard **each of 8 different** medium value fabrics for blocks,
OR a variety of 30 different rectangles, 7 3/4" x 10"
Choose a mix of red, cranberry and orange fabrics.

1/4 yard **each of 4 different** medium value fabrics for blocks,
OR a variety of 16 different rectangles, 7 3/4" x 10"
Choose a mix of light gold, tan and pink fabrics.

5/8 yards fabric for binding 1 1/8 yard fabric for border

4 1/8 yards fabric for backing 71" x 85" piece of batting

Suggested Ruler: **Curves For Rectangles CGRKA2 by Creative Grids**
