

# Fresh Cut

Finished Size: 62" x 77 1/2"

Block Size: 8 1/2" x 8 1/2"

This quilt is a lot of fun to make and can be pulled together easily from a mix of light and dark fabrics. Many of my quilts contain more fabrics than the requirements call for – I always enjoy throwing in an extra print or two from my stash just to spice things up. The requirements below list the necessary yardage as well as the total number of squares needed if you choose to work from your stash. Decide on a theme such as brights, batiks, florals, etc. then divide your mix into light and darks and start cutting squares! Make your quilt scrappy or work from your stash. Enjoy!

## SUPPLIES:

Suggested Pattern: Square Borne

Sewing machine in good working order  
Basic rotary cutting and sewing supplies  
9 1/2" x 9 1/2" square ruler – or larger  
OPTIONAL: 2 yds white flannel for design wall

## Materials

- 1/3 yard each of 6 different lime green prints for blocks  
OR a variety of 24 squares, 9" x 9"
- 1/3 yard each of 5 different medium to dark green prints for border  
OR a variety of 16 squares, 9" x 9"
- 5/8 yard each of 5 different black and white prints for blocks and border  
OR a variety of 40 squares, 9" x 9"
- 5/8 yard fabric for binding • 4 yards fabric for backing
- 70" x 85" piece of batting

Suggested Ruler: **Straight Out of Line, CGRKA3 by Creative Grids**

PLEASE PRE-CUT FABRIC FOR BLOCKS PRIOR TO CLASS, REFER TO THE PATTERN FOR INSTRUCTIONS.
