

Square Borne

Finished Size: 55" x 77"

Block Size: 7 3/4" x 7 3/4"

This quilt is a lot of fun to make and is simply a mix of light & dark fabrics. The unusual way the squares are cut and then sewn together creates a unique sort of patchwork. Many of my quilts contain more fabrics than the requirements call for - as I enjoy throwing in an extra print or two from my stash just to spice things up. The requirements below list the necessary yardage as well as the total number of squares needed if you choose to make your quilt scrappy or work from your stash. Enjoy!

SUPPLIES:

Suggested Pattern: Square Borne

Sewing machine in good working order

Basic rotary cutting and sewing supplies

9 1/2" x 9 1/2" square ruler – or larger

OPTIONAL: 2 yds white flannel for design wall



Materials

1/3 yard each of 10 different dark value prints for blocks,
OR a variety of 30 squares, 9 1/2" x 9 1/2"

1/3 yard each of 10 different light value prints for blocks,
OR a variety of 30 squares, 9 1/2" x 9 1/2"

2/3 yard fabric for binding

4 yards fabric yards for backing

65" x 87" piece of batting

Curves for Squares CGRKA1 by Creative Grids

PLEASE PRE-CUT FABRIC FOR BLOCKS PRIOR TO CLASS, REFER TO THE PATTERN FOR INSTRUCTIONS.
