Finished Size: 50 1/4" x 62 1/2"
Block Size: 12 1/4" x 12 1/4"

This quilt is a blast to make and can be pulled together easily from a mix of light and dark fabrics. Many of my quilts contain more fabrics than the requirements call for - I always enjoy throwing in an extra print or two from my stash just to spice things up. The requirements below list the necessary yardage, as well as the total number of rectangles needed if you choose to work from your stash.

SUPPLIES:
Suggested Pattern: Savanna


Sewing machine in good working order
Basic rotary cutting and sewing supplies
12 1/2" x 12 1/2" square ruler
OPTIONAL: 2 yds white flannel for design wall

## Materials

$1 / 3$ yard each of 4 different dark value prints for blocks
OR a variety of 24 dark $61 / 4$ " x 8 " rectangles
$1 / 3$ yard each 4 different light prints for blocks
OR a variety of 24 light $61 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 8$ " rectangles
$1 / 3$ yard fabric for inner border
$11 / 8$ yards of fabric for the outer border
$31 / 3$ yards fabric for the backing
$1 / 2$ yard fabric for binding
$59 " \times 71$ " piece of batting
